Knowledge

How do you explore art work thoroughly? (looking, talking and drawing)

What does the phrase Painting with scissors mean? (Henri Matisse)

How can you use collage techniques and knowledge of shape and colour to create a creative response?

What are negative and positive shapes? (Positive shapes are shapes of actual objects, negative shapes are the areas between.)
