Skills

I can describe the position of human/physical features in my local area using simple compass directions (north, south, east, west, near, far)

I can use an aerial photograph of the local area of the school to construct a simple map with a key showing basic symbols of features

I can ask simple geographical questions about my local area

I can suggest ideas for improving the school environment
